Exhibition will be held in Kobe International Exhibition Hall No.2.

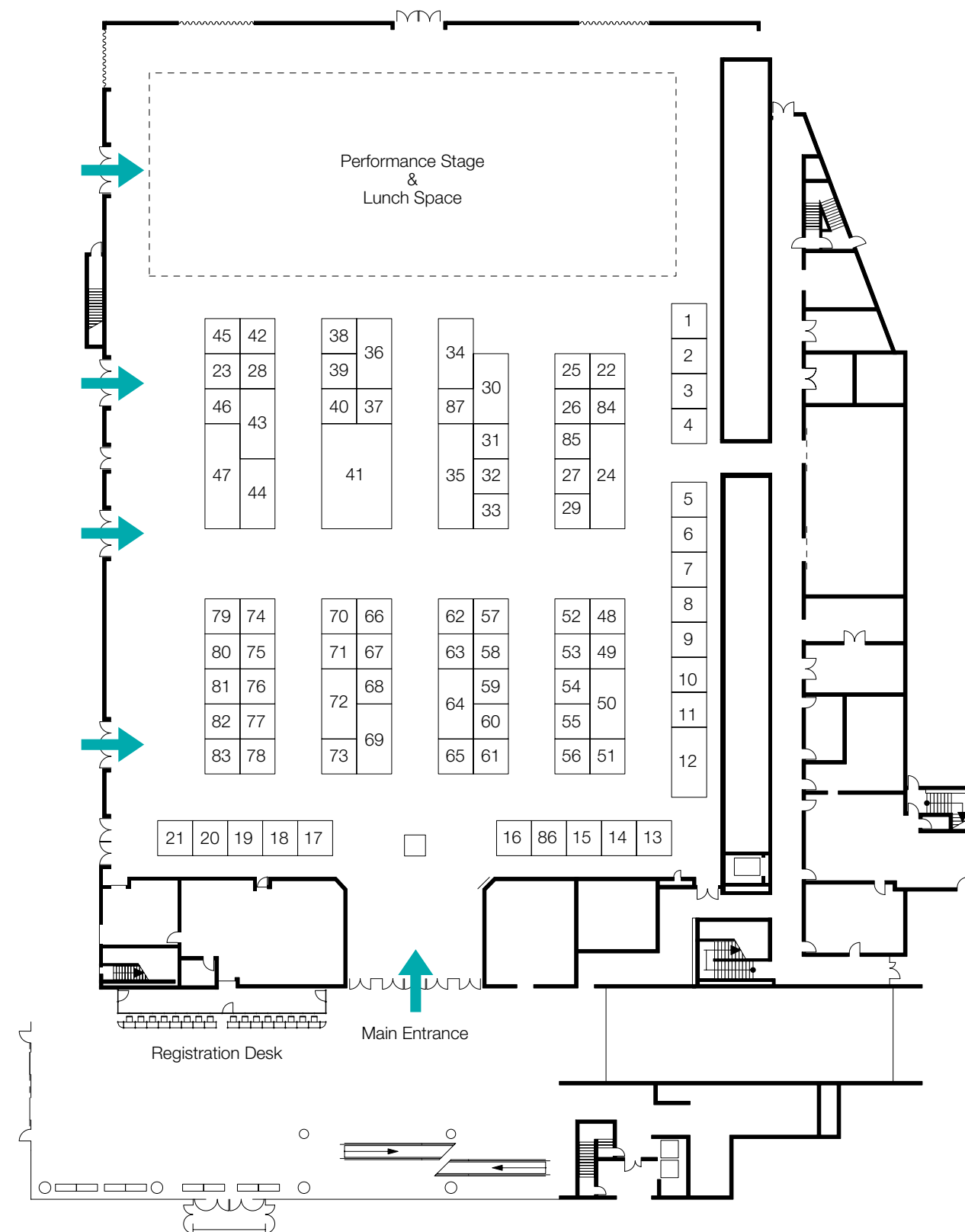
- Date of Event : **July 2 (Sat.)** 9:00-17:00

Cultural Program at the Congress site

A stage will be set in Kobe International Exhibition Hall and will serve as the main venue on July 2 and 3 for approximately twenty presentations including performances by participants of the Cultural Program and film artworks. The program will display themes such as HIV/AIDS and sex work, expressions of diverse sexual identities, call for safer sex and support for vulnerable communities through various forms of expression including music and dance. It aims at deepening one's understanding on various HIV/AIDS related issues and challenges in a friendly atmosphere. More information will be available at the Information Desk.

Other events to be held outside the Congress site

KAVCAAP2005 HIV/AIDS - The Future Document

This event will take place as part of the 7th ICAAP Cultural Program and at the same time it will be opened to the public. The purpose of this event is to deliver information on HIV/AIDS through artworks and to provide a place and opportunity to think about the society and forms of expression. The program includes exhibitions of 7 themes to display situations in India, Thailand and Japan; films and documentary footages and symposia attended by filmmakers. There will be Asian food served by "Asian Kitchen", a project by a community in Kobe which was founded after the Great Hanshin Earthquake, and performances by participants of the Cultural Program. It is designed to serve as a meeting point for all parties involved and to create positive forces for the future of the fight against HIV/AIDS.
