

Program Structure

Plenary Sessions

Experts on HIV/AIDS-related issues will be invited from around the world to give plenary lectures during the Congress. It will be a great chance for delegates to listen to the world's most distinguished researchers, community leaders and policy specialists. Plenary Sessions will be held every morning from July 2 to 5, and English-Japanese simultaneous translation will be provided.

Symposia

Invited speakers will discuss cross-track issues in the Symposia. There will be six or more Symposia taking place after the Plenary Sessions from July 2 to 4, and English-Japanese simultaneous translation will be provided in some of the sessions.

Oral Sessions

Each presentation will consist of a ten-minute presentation followed by a five-minute discussion. The 7th ICAAP deals with diverse topics and they are divided into five tracks, namely;

[Track A: Basic and Clinical Sciences]

Track A will focus on a wide variety of topics in basic and clinical sciences, such as virology, immunology, molecular epidemiology, human genome science, treatment, clinical trials, drug discovery, drug resistance, adverse event, opportunistic infections, and vaccine development.

[Track B: Treatment, Care and Support]

Track B will focus on issues related to community responses as well as treatment, care and support. Some key topics are the “3 by 5” initiative, treatment options for minimizing side effects, palliative and terminal care; and treatment, care and support in resource-limited settings.

[Track C: Prevention and Epidemiology]

Track C will focus on trends, dynamics and impact of the HIV epidemic in the Asia/Pacific region as well as research for an in-depth understanding of HIV vulnerability and prevention activities rooted in various communities.

[Track D: Culture, Gender and Sexual Issues]

Track D will focus on issues such as sexual issues that are closely related to HIV/AIDS and are the single most deeply rooted cause of stigma, discrimination and denial. Issues involving gender, empowerment of women and children and cultural issues are included.

[Track E: Political, Economic and Social Contexts]

Track E will focus on ways to respond to the social and economic impact of HIV/AIDS. Government leadership and a coalition with a wide range of sectors such as infected individuals, the socially disadvantaged, NGOs/CBOs, business enterprises and international agencies are essential for effective implementation of policies.

Poster Presentation

Poster presenters will be requested to stand by their posters during lunchtime (12:30-14:30) on their presentation day from July 2 to 4. Posters will be displayed throughout the day of presentation (9:00-17:30).

Posters will be displayed in order of the Tracks (A-E) and will be sorted by the first keyword in alphabetical order.

Skills Building Workshops

Providing the opportunity to learn concrete skills to use in various activities, the skills-building workshops will concentrate on capacity, technique and know-how building. The delegates who have diverse backgrounds and experiences from all over the region will transfer their skills to the participants in a most participatory and practical approach.

Some workshops will be in Japanese. Skills Building Workshop admittance will be on a first-come, first-served basis. Participants are requested to be at the door of each workshop 30 minutes before it starts as the number of seats are limited.

Community Forum

The Community Forum will provide an opportunity for Japanese communities to network and share experiences with their Asia-Pacific counterparts, and also to discuss and strategize regarding the issues most important to each community on a regional level. The forum will be held in collaboration with the Seven Sisters coalition of Asia Pacific HIV/AIDS networks on the first day of the Congress, July 1 (prior to the Opening Ceremony).

This Forum is sponsored by GSK Positive Action, and supported by Japanese Trade Union Confederation.



HIV Positive Forum

HIV Positive Forum is a closed-door session for PLWHA. The program includes guidance for 7th ICAAP and Kobe City and round table discussions on five different themes. The forum aims to deepen understanding of the participants as well as to expand their networks through discussions, which they can bring back to their communities and reflect in their local activities.

Youth Forum

Youth Forum is a session for the participants under 25 years old. The forum will be organized by young people and will provide a place for discussion for the younger generation who are supposed to play a significant role in the community. It also aims to make the voices of young people heard in the main Congress and to create their networks. English-Japanese simultaneous translation will be provided.

Youth Forum is supported with charitable funds from Johnson & Johnson Contribution Committee.
